



- Secondary enrollment will decrease as smaller classes make their way through the system.




- Cottonwood is the only building that may face capacity challenges.
- The highest density of students is in the Sunset/Heartland area.




- There has been little housing development in the last 3 years; development that did occur was expensive.





Mill Levy History








